

1. **T-shirt pick-up:** Each unit has a special colored shirt, **Campers must wear their camp shirt each day.** T-shirts **should NOT be altered in any way** (for safety reasons), but we've found that having ties to tie up the sleeves and a band to make them shorter works really well and helps keep the girls a little cooler.  
**NOTE FOR UNIT 5:** Campers in **unit 5 do not need to pick up shirts** because they will be tie dying on Tuesday. We'll bring the shirts to camp. Campers in Unit 5 should **wear a WHITE shirt on Tuesday.**
2. **TSHIRT PICKUP** IS Wednesday, July 14<sup>th</sup> from 2:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. at 18625 Irvine Way in Lakeville.
2. **Drop off/Pick Up:** **Drop off is at 7:30 a.m.** each morning and **pick up is at 5:00 p.m.** each day at **Steve Michaud Park**, 17100 Ipava Ave, Lakeville (formerly North Park). Make sure your camper is on time because busses cannot wait for campers.
3. **Pick up for campers attending the Thursday evening campfire program** is 10:30 p.m. at Steve Michaud Park.
4. **Absent Camper:** If your camper will be absent call Sherri Schaible at 612.910.7267 **by 7:30** so we aren't delayed.
5. **Water Bottles:** Make sure your camper has **at least 1 refillable water bottle.** It is usually hot at camp and we need to drink lots of water. We have many opportunities to refill throughout the day. Also, talk to your camper about how important it is to drink water throughout the day.
6. **Shoes/Hair/Hat:** For safety reasons, **girls must wear closed toe shoes - NO flip flops or sandals!** They should also **wear their hair up** or wear **a hat** to keep cool!
7. **Food:** Girls should have a **good breakfast prior to coming to the park.** Please make sure they have a couple of **nutritious snacks** that they can eat throughout the day. **Nothing that will melt!** This is important because it can be many hours between their breakfast and lunch and lunch and getting back home. Also, if your camper is a **picky eater**, make sure to pack a few extra things. Lunch at camp is really tasty and the girls have options – but if you know that they might not eat well – better to be safe than sorry.
8. **No cell phones** are allowed.
9. **Swimming:** Campers **swim every day – weather permitting!** It is a great idea to have the **camper wear her swimsuit and bring a change of underclothes along to change into after swimming.** This saves time and allows campers to have as much time in the pool as possible. Also make sure your camper has a **towel and a plastic bag to put her wet clothes in** so everything else in her backpack stays dry.

### 11. COVID REQUIREMENTS:

1. **Masks:** The Girl Scout Council has increased our ability to gather in groups of 25 outdoors without masks, if we are able to be socially distant. We are trying our best to ensure that we can do this throughout the day. A couple of exceptions:
  - i. **Masks will be required on the bus**
  - ii. **Masks will be required when we gather in larger groups, such as at our morning and evening flag ceremonies**
  - iii. **If we are required to be indoors – we will only do this for inclement weather**
2. **Testing positive for COVID:** If a camper tests positive for COVID, all campers in their Unit Patrol will be required to stay home. For this reason, we are trying to
